Scams

PSE&G –Phone and distraction. Long Island employees have photo identification badges that must be displayed at all times. If you are not sure of an employee's identity or have difficulty with the badges when someone comes to your home, call PSEG Long Island's customer service center at 1-800-490-0025. Gift Cards.

IRS – Phone, warrant threats, gift cards.

- If you know, or believe, that you owe taxes, contact the IRS at 1-800-829-1040.
- If you know that you do not owe taxes and believe that the call was a scam attempt, please call the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1-800-366-4484.

Extortion-Car accident or kidnapping, gift cards. Claims they are watching the victim.

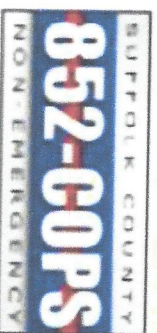
